#### Keeping Ancram the way it is... only better!

That's the future we decided to build together back in 2010 when we adopted Ancram's first ever Comprehensive Plan!

We had found by talking to one another in workshops and through our survey that we all *like* our town - our open spaces and farming heritage, our natural resources and what they contribute to our quality of life here, our historic and cultural heritage. We just wanted some improvements.



But to make the improvements we all wanted, we knew we had to make some changes. Here's how we made it happen, in a nutshell:

- Managed our finances and organization to keep town taxes flat (they actually declined!) and to develop the resources to invest in our facilities, roads and equipment.
- To keep everyone informed and involved, implemented an extensive communications program based on AncramTownNews, Ancramemails, AncramDirectory. Sponsored many more events at Town Hall.
- 3. Developed new resources to help identify, manage and fund our progress by encouraging volunteers, getting grants, and attracting donations. Turn the page to see what we did!
- Revised Zoning to support the Comp Plan and our vision of the future—our step-by-step approach to accomplishing the first zoning changes in 40 years shown below.

## Zoning and Land Subdivision Laws revised 2011-2017 to support Comp Plan. Zoning Revisions Committee members listed on p. 4.

We took a step-by-step approach so that our Zoning Revisions Committee of volunteers could consider details carefully and Town residents could more easily participate in sections of greatest interest to them.

First, the 1972 Zoning Ordinance was revised and adopted by the Town Board in 5 separate packages:

Package 1 - July 21, 2011

Package 2 - October 20, 2011.

Package 3 - September 20, 2012 and October 18, 2012.

Package 4 - February 21, 2013

Package 5 - June 19, 2014.

(Sections I, VII, VIII, IX, X, XI, XII)

(Sections V (I), XIII)

(Sections II, III, IV (B), IV (I), V (J))

(Sections IV, V, V (J) (10))

(Section V (H))

Second, the 5 packages were combined into one Zoning Law, adopted on November 20, 2014.

Third, Land Subdivision Regulations were handled separately. Regulations were adopted in preliminary form in 2015, and then reconfigured, finalized, and adopted as Local Law #3 of 2017, June 2017.

Rather than waiting another 40 years, the Town intends to refine or add regulations as the need arises.
