for Emergency Notification is operating

The county's new reverse 911 system started this September. You're already receiving recorded announcements if your phone number is listed.

This new system provides community alerts for emergencies, weather warnings, missing children, etc.

County officials were stimulated to install this new system when they learned with the August fire at TCI Recycling plant in Ghent that they had no way to notify citizens of evacuation plans.

There was something for all ages, even a bit of dancing to Ancram's own Bash Bish Bluegrass Band!


All are welcome again to this year's event the Highway Garage is a great place for a party!
