New Town Board Addresses 2010 Budget

At the February town board meeting, Supervisor Art Bassin distributed his Supervisor's Financial Summary for 2010. (Copies are available at town hall and on the website.)

Art notes that the Town had \$739,999 on hand at the beginning of 2010 – before the \$921,000 of 2010 property taxes were deposited in the bank.

2010 revenues in total are budgeted to be \$170,000 less than 2009. Of this, property taxes are expected to be flat from last year, while the large part of the revenue decline is from sales tax, mortgage tax, and state & federal highway aid, about \$150,000 lower in total.

2010 expenses are budgeted to be \$24,000 higher than last year.

The town highway department spending in 2010 will be \$931,000, 67% of the total budget.

The town board has identified possible savings for the year near \$80,000 –

funds that will be used to plan for the new town garage and cover the town's share of the solar panel installation at town hall. (The largest share of the cost of the solar panels is coming from a grant.)

Art says the major financial issue facing the town is how best to provide needed facilities and equipment for the town Highway Department.

"The Board's goal is to meet these challenges without going into debt," he says, "and without raising taxes. To do this, we need to develop a detailed capital plan over the next few months that will carry us through the next few years."

The basics of this plan will include:

- Generating cost savings from our current budget,
- Seeking grant monies,
- Taking advantage of the existing garage site

to build a new facility that meets our needs at the lowest possible cost,

- Expanding our practice of sharing, purchasing or leasing new highway equipment with nearby towns and the County,
- Exploring options to avoid spending \$100,000 on a salt shed through cooperation with other towns and the County.

High Costs to Repair Roads

At the January town board meeting, Highway Superintendent Jim MacArthur (left) explained why some town roads are in such poor condition.

“From experience,” Jim said, “I know what’s required to fix our roads the right way, unfortunately, the town can’t afford it.”

Jim noted it would take about \$450,000 a mile to

fix a road effectively, plus he would have to shut the road down for five to six months to get the job done.

“I know you wouldn’t stand for that,” he added.

This year, Jim plans to finish work on Poole Hill, work on Cottontail and widen it, and complete drainage work on Maple Lane and Town Road.

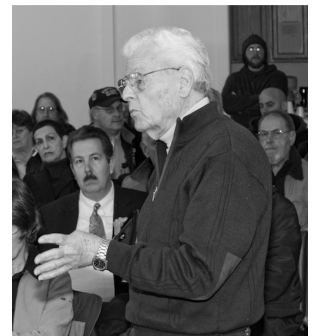

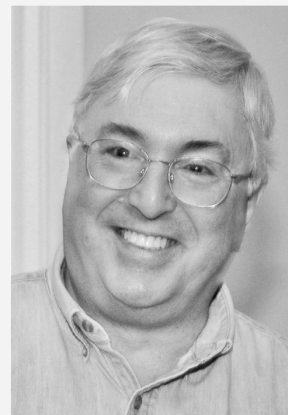

Looking Ahead to a Good Year *Town Supervisor Art Bassin*

Ancram is off to a great start in 2010. The Comp Plan will be adopted, and the new Zoning Revisions Committee has started work. Experienced leaders chair the Planning Board and Zoning Board of Appeals. We are planning for Agriculture and Farmland Protection, a new garage at the existing site, and emergency preparedness. We are studying the property tax assessment process. We

passed increased senior, low income, disability and veteran's property tax exemptions. This spring, volunteers will paint the town hall, under the direction of Ancram painter Jane Moore. Thanks to Bob Murphy, we got a large grant to help pay for solar panels on the town hall, and I bet Bob Roth will get us a cell tower in 2010. Our new Conservation Advisory Council is helping with environmental matters.

Ancram Community Days will be August 14-15. The Youth Commission plans a dozen events. The Ethics Board will update the town's Ethics Law. The Communications Committee has improved this newsletter and will revamp the town website to be more informative. The Community Grants Committee is looking for funds to support our priorities. Together, we are all making Ancram a better place.

- improving highway safety at the intersection of Routes 82 and 7 in Ancram,

- constructing a town garage, and
- upgrading the town pool and playground.
